Traffic enforcements begin

The Hood River City Police Department and the Hood River County Sheriff's Department have announced traffic enforcement patrol increases in the coming weeks, with an emphasis on seat belts, speed and cell phone use while driving.

The Hood River City Police Department will run their traffic safety Blitz campaign May 18 through May 31. The purpose of this traffic enforcement is to promote safety, compliance, and to reduce the number of motor vehicle related injuries or deaths. This enforcement campaign will take place throughout the state.

The Hood River County Sheriff's Office will increase its traffic patrols for the upcoming Memorial holiday weekend. The goal is to reduce traffic crashes and increase safety through high visibility enforcement. Everyone is urged drive with care, wear a safety belt and not drive when using substances that impair, including prescription medication, alcohol, marijuana or any other impairing substance. Please report suspected impaired drivers by calling 911.

Oregon law requires a child weighing less than 40 pounds to be properly restrained by a child safety seat. A child under one year of age or weighing less than 20 pounds must be restrained in a rear-facing child seat. A child over 40

pounds but under age eight or less than 4 feet, 9 inches tall must be restrained in either a child seat with a harness system or in a booster seat that raises the child up so that a lap and shoulder belt system fit correctly.

To that end, there is a free car seat check from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the Hood River

Fire and EMS Station, 1785 Meyer Parkway, on the second Wednesday of every month. This month, it will be held May 13. Expectant parents, grandparents and parents of children under 4 feet 9 inches are encouraged to attend to have seat installations checked by car seat technician Elizabeth Stillwell.
