

## Cloud Cap Inn tours beginning June 21

Parkdale — The Mt. Hood National Forest Service will be hosting free interpretive tours of the historic Cloud Cap Inn starting June 21 through Labor Day on September 7, weather and road conditions permitting. The Hood River Ranger District is inviting the public to tour the inn, discover its history, and enjoy the majesty of Mt. Hood.

The forest service will be hosting the tours on Sundays throughout the summer. Tours will start at 11:00 a.m. and at 1:00 p.m. and last approximately 45 minutes to one hour.

The tours will be limited to 12 people per group. Reservation slots go quickly, so book your tour soon. The reservation system protects the inn and ensures visitors get a quality historical experience. Please see reservation contact information

Cloud Cap Inn stands on the northeastern flank of Mount Hood in the Hood River Ranger District of the Mt. Hood National Forest. The crescent-style log structure was the first permanent resort lodge of its kind on the mountain.

Cloud Cap Inn was built in 1889 to be an elite mountain retreat and is now a search and rescue base for the Hood River Crag Rats, the oldest search and rescue organization in the United States. The Hood River Crag Rats began caring for the structure in 1952 under a special use permit with the Mt. Hood National Forest.

The Crag Rats and local forest workers have been restoring the aged structure over the last few decades and their work is nearly complete.

Cloud Cap Inn is listed on

the National Register of Historic Places. The building has endured years of extreme winters and mountain storms, and has been one of the unique and truly exceptional destinations of Mt. Hood for the last 100 years. Views from the inn are incredible and access to the Mt. Hood Wilderness is just adjacent to the lodge.

The road to the lodge, which leads from Cooper Spur to the Cloud Cap Inn, was closed for several summers until last year, due to concerns that trees killed by a 2008 forest fire would tumble down onto the road.

This year, the road is open once again and tours will kick off on June 21.

## Performing arts director nominated for Tony award

Mosier Schools' Performing Arts Director Betsy Oslund Harmon has been nominated for a Tony award. Community members and current and former students nominated Harmon for the national award, "Excellence in Theatre Education," on Sunday, March 31, 2015 with letters of reference and a three-

minute video tribute.

Harmon leads the schools' drama club and choir program, for which she writes and directs at least two original musical comedies every year. She has written and produced 27 original plays in her 12 years at Mosier Schools. According to the school's tribute video, Harmon has written

1,294 roles into her plays.

"What I hope to achieve with every show is to see that look on the kids' faces after the curtain closes, a look that says 'I was an important part of something that was a success,'" said Harmon.

Any student who joins the schools' drama club or choir is guaranteed a role in the play. In fact, every student in the school participates in each production in some capacity, be it through singing, set building, and/or costume design and creation.

"This is thrilling," said Harmon. "I am so grateful to the community of Mosier. All my life I've wanted to say, 'It's an honor just to be nominated' and now I can check that off my bucket list!"

The Tony Awards Ceremony will be hosted June 7 in New York City. The award includes a \$10,000 cash prize for the teacher's school.

## Teen arrested in Washougal High bomb threat

Washougal — Police arrested a teenager Thursday in connection with a bomb threat made earlier last week at Washougal High School.

The incident occurred Tuesday at approximately 10 a.m., when Principal Aaron Hansen alerted Washougal Police School Resource Officer Ryan Castro that a handwritten note was discovered in a restroom stall.

Washougal High School, located at 1201 39th St., was evacuated and then searched by staff and Washougal police officers. No bomb was found, so students were released back to class just after 11 a.m.

According to the Washougal Police Department, the ju-

venile male suspect was booked into the Clark County Juvenile Detention Center on charges of threats to bomb or injure property, a Class B felony.

According to police, there is no indication that an actual bomb existed.

John and Linda Hardhams' last name was misspelled in a photo in the May 30 edition. See page B2 for a corrected reprint.

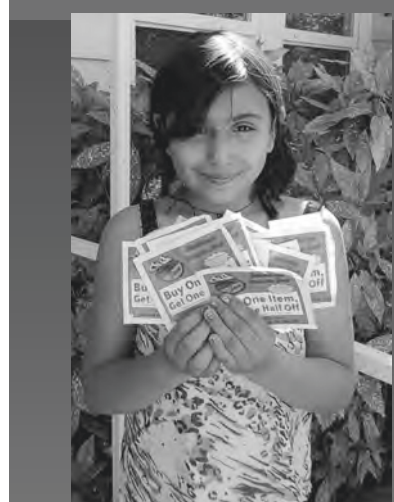
