This application is being re-noticed since it was revised.

Tim Huberd has applied for a National Scenic Area Permit and a Floodplain Permit, on behalf of Stan and Mary Graves, to construct 2 single-story additions to their single family dwelling, one addition is 8' x 10', on its N side, the other addition is 7.5'

x 19' on its W side; and a single-story addition (12' x 20') to their detached garage. A Variance to the 100 foot stream setback is being considered as part of this review.
