Native plants now available to order

Hood River Soil and Water Conservation District is again hosting its native plant sale and is currently taking orders. "Winter is the perfect time to plan additions to your garden and landscaping," said a HRSWCD press release. "We are happy to announce that we are now taking orders for our 2020 native plant sale. Native plant species can sometimes be hard to find in typical nurseries. We provide a low-cost option to obtain locally sourced plants." This year, HRSWCD has added pollinator plants to its sale, "including showy milkweed and red-stemmed ceanothus. And back by popular request is the giant sequoia, paper birch, and Pacific dogwood," said the press release.

Native plants are adapted to the unique climate and soils of this region and provide the benefits of wildlife and pollinator habitat, soil stabilization, and water conservation.
