

ing areas — have shut down their properties to encourage proper social distancing. Within the National Scenic Area boundaries, all National Forest System lands are closed as of March 26, and will remain closed until further notice.

"We acknowledge that this closure comes at a time when many were seeking respite in natural areas; however, this is a temporary pause to help health authorities get the COVID-19 pandemic under control. Thank you for doing your part to help prevent the spread of the disease," said Lynn Burditt, forest supervisor for the national scenic area, in a press release.

A few days after declaring the new executive order, Gov. Brown issued further guidance for Oregonians on following it:

"My top priority is to keep Oregonians safe and healthy — whether they are living sheltered or unsheltered - as we focus on stopping the spread of COVID-19," said Brown in a press release. "That is why my executive order directs Oregonians to stay home whenever possible and prohibits social and recreational gatherings. I know that in practice this may look different for each Oregonian, but the spirit of the order is clear: Limit your social circles to your utmost ability." The advice for combating

the spread of COVID-19 remains the same: Stay home when you can, and maintain at least 6-feet of distance between you and others when you are out; wash hands with soap and water frequently; and avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth with your hands. If you do get sick, you are advised to self-isolate at home, even if you have mild symptoms. Most cases of COVID-19 will recover without medical intervention, but if you have difficulty breathing, or any other serious medical emergency, call 911. Anyone with questions is advised to call their primary medical provider.
