The school teachers of Illinois have done a great work in the protection of birds, says the Chicago Tribune. They have aided and supplanted the work of the Audubon Society, and all the other associations which are interested in giving "our friends in feathers" a good chance. Five years ago few people paid much attention to the native song birds. Their eggs were stolen,



their nests broken up, and the birds themselves wantonly destroyed. At present there are more than 35,000 people in the State who are actively interested in preserving and fostering the birds.

The State game commissioner, aided by the Audubon Society, has had posted on the outside of every postoffice in the State a large placard calling attention to the law which forbids the killing or confinement of native birds, and asking the assistance of the public in enforcing it.

Under its provisions there are only four species of native birds which it is lawful to keep in confinement. They are the crow, the crow blackbird, the chicken hawk, and the English sparrow. Any person who kills any other bird, or who keeps it in captivity or destroys its nest or eggs is subject to a fine of \$5 and costs or to a sentence of ten days in jail, or to both for each offense.

Collecting of either eggs or birds is allowed only for scientific purposes, and every person engaged in it must comply with some onerous conditions. No person under 15 years old is allowed to do collecting under any circumstances. A person of proper age who wishes to collect must first secure the indorsement of at least two scientists of note; he must file a bond for \$200 in the County Court, and must, in addition, pay a license fee.

As one result of the work of the Audubon society many people living in and near Chicago have been led to take an active interest in the care as well as the protection of birds. There are in Cook County several hundred "bird tables," which are kept up all winter

by bird lovers. A "bird table" consists of a board supported between two branches of a tree, on which are exposed small dishes which are regularly kept filled with seed, while above is fastened a large piece of beef suet. Such a table will attract a whole host of birds, who will remain welcome visitors all the winter through. Among the birds which will be attracted by a "bird table" are blue jays, nutatches, chickadees, red-headed woodpeckers, downy woodpeckers, kinglets, gold finches and English sparrows.
