

**FATHER OF IRRIGATION.**  
Congressman Newlands of Nevada Has  
Earned the Title.  
Probably no measure so far-reach-  
ing in importance as regards the  
development of this country has been  
enacted in recent  
years as the New-  
lands irrigation bill.  
While taking not a  
dollar directly from  
the public treasury,  
it nevertheless pro-  
vides for an expend-  
iture which it is  
estimated will ag-  
gregate in the next  
30 years fully \$150,-  
000,000. Most bills  
take the form of an  
appropriation for a single year, but  
this measure appropriates the proceeds  
from the sale of the public lands in 13  
States and 3 Territories for all time  
to be devoted to works of irrigation.  
Further it acts automatically and will  
require no further legislation. The en-  
actment of the bill means that the vast  
area which was once known as the  
Great American Desert is to be trans-  
formed into fertile soil to provide  
homes for additional millions of Amer-  
ican citizens, and will yield products  
of untold wealth.  
In short, the bill provides that the  
receipts from the sale of public lands  
shall be set apart in the treasury in a  
fund to be known as the arid land re-  
clamation fund. This income com-  
prises the proceeds from the sales of  
mining and mineral lands, timber  
lands, stone lands, as well as arid  
lands, and aggregate now about \$3,-  
000,000 a year. The money is to be  
placed in the treasury every year and  
expended by the Secretary of the In-  
terior in the construction of irrigation  
works necessary to make the waters  
available for settlers, authority being  
given the Secretary to make contracts  
only when money necessary for each  
particular section of a contemplated  
project is in the fund.  
Congressman Francis G. Newlands,  
of Nevada, introduced this bill, and  
fought for its passage to the end. He  
thus gained for himself the title of  
Father of Irrigation. Mr. Newlands  
is a man of brilliant parts and is ac-  
counted the intellectual superior of  
Senators Stewart and Jones, the lat-  
ter of whom he will succeed in the  
Senate when his term expires. New-  
lands is 54 years old. He graduated  
from Yale and was admitted to the  
bar in Washington. He went to San  
Francisco to practice law and remained  
there until 1886, when he became trust-  
ee of the estate of William Sharon,  
formerly United States Senator from  
Nevada. He removed to that State  
and in 1888 became a citizen. Four  
years later he was elected to Congress,  
where he has since remained.

**ELECTRIC DANCERS.**  
  
With the help of electricity in its sim-  
plest form a great many tricks and en-

glass about twelve inches long by eight

you stop rubbing the funny actions of  
the figures are continued for awhile.  
When the dance is ended the touch of  
the hand on the glass is sufficient to en-  
liven the figures again.
