Nobody can tell when, or just where, he is going to jump, and accurate focus is out of the question. Probably the accompanying picture is the most successful photo of a leaping salmon ever taken. It was made by an officer of the United States fish commission on the Island of Afognak, off the coast of Alaska, and the big fish is jumping up a fall to get to the spawning grounds in the headwaters of the stream.

Labor on Railroad Folders. The average person who picks up a

railroad time folder does not realize the amount of work which the preparation of such a publication involves. A big Western railroad, for instance, has a general time folder made up from sixteen different divisions operating time tables. The folder contains 2.000 names of towns, gives the schedules of over 500 trains and whenever there is a change in time 60,000 figures have to be carefully checked and corrected.
