CIRCUS MEN LIVE IN COMFORT.

Newsdays Performers of the Ring
Travel in Style.
"How does a circus man or woman
live while on the road?" said a circus
man to a reporter for the Kansas City
Journal. "Why, they live better than
ever before. We carry almost 1,000 peo-
ple, and I doubt if you can find one of
that number who is discontented with
his or her lot. Several years ago it was
customary with the majority of circuses
to provide inferior cars for their busi-
ness staff and performers and compel
the laborers to sleep under the big red
wagons or the flat car. The passage of
time has changed the order of things.
Circus folks now travel as well, if not
better, than the majority of men and
women who are continually moving
from one portion of the United States
to the other in search of pleasure.
"Our business staff and performers
live in spacious Pullman cars. The beds
are soft and roomy and the bed clothing
is always fresh and clean. The circus
has twelve Pullmans of this kind, and
on each one is a porter, whose duty it is
to polish the shoes of all the occupants
each night, look after the laundry and
make the beds and sweep and dust the
cars. These cars are vestibuled and
at the head of the train is an extra long
dining car, where the majority of the
people are fed. This diner is looked
after by a competent steward, with a
staff of good cooks and waiters, and
breakfast and dinner are served there
each day. The performers take their
luncheon on the circus grounds imme-
diately after the parade.
"The laborers, including the drivers,
canvasmen, hostlers, property handlers
and animal men, are served with three
meals on the grounds. The food pro-
vided is of the best, and there is al-
ways plenty of it. Every laborer has a
bed. The drivers and hostlers have
swinging bunks in the cars, directly
above their horses; the animal men are
accommodated in cozy little staterooms
fitted up in the big elephant cars, while
the property handlers and canvasmen
sleep in coaches that greatly resemble
tourist cars. Everyone has good quar-
ters and splendid food, and, in conse-
quence, it is seldom that a complaint is
heard."

JUDICIAL DECISIONS
A majority of the stockholders of a
corporation are held in Maynard vs.
Looker (Mich., 56 L. R. A. 927), to
have not vested right to elect the di-
rectors, which will be infringed by a
statute giving the minority stockhold-
ers the power by cumulative voting to
elect a representative membership in the
board of directors.
A regular full-rate non-coupon rail-
road ticket is held, in Louisville &
Nashville Railroad Company vs. Kly-
man (Tenn., 56 L. R. A. 793), in the
absence of an agreement to the con-
trary, to be good for a continuous pas-
sage to destination only, and if the
journey necessitates a change of trains
it is held that it must be continued on
the next available train.
Sureties on a guardian's bond, taken
upon motion of a surety on a former
bond for the purpose of procuring his
release, are held, in Abshire vs. Sal-
yer (Ky., 56 L. R. A. 936), to be liable,
equally with the surety on the former
bond, for the past as well as future
defaultation of the guardian, although
the motion seeks to relieve the former
surety from future liability only.
The organizers of a corporation are
held in Vermont Marble Company vs.
Delez Granite Company (Cal. 56, L.
R. A. 728), to be liable to pay in for
the benefit of creditors the face value
of the stock issued by them, although
they made no written subscription, but
agreed orally that the stock should be
sold to them as fully paid upon pay-
ment of a fraction only of its face
value.
A devise to trustees for accumulation
for a period of thirty years when
the property is to be distributed ac-
cording to directions as to possible con-
ditions existing at that time is held
in Andrews vs. Lincoln (Me.), 36 L.
R. A. 103, to be void as creating an
unlawful perpetuity, although the trust-
ees are empowered to appropriate por-
tions of the income to the support of
testator's son and his wife and the
education of the grandchildren.
A street car conductor's trip report
as to fares taken is held, in Callihan
vs. Washington Water Power Com-
pany (Wash.), 56 L. R. A. 72, to be
admissible in evidence in corrobora-
tion of his testimony that he received
no transfer on a trip, for alleged in-
juries during which an action has been
brought against the company by one
claiming to have ridden on that trip
and to have paid fare with a transfer,
where it was made before he knew of
the accident or that any question
as to his having taken a transfer
would arise.
