RACING WITH PROA BOATS.

Fragile Craft that Can Sail Twenty
 Miles an Hour.
 The most interesting feature of the
 yacht club at Biscayne Bay, Florida, is
 the number of proas owned by the
 members. In no other section is the
 building of them carried on and their
 use encouraged and practiced, says the
 Illustrated News. Until within the
 last few years, these fragile craft did
 not come practically before yachts-
 men. It was in countries where trade
 winds prevail that they were built
 and sailed, and we are told by Folkard
 and others that they have been in use
 in the Ladrone and South Sea islands
 for several thousands of years.

When we see one of these dainty
 craft, twenty-four feet long and only
 two feet wide, with an outrigger look-
 ing all the world over like a "straddle
 bug," as it rushes through the water
 enveloped in mist at the rate of twenty
 miles an hour, the two men on board,
 one at the helm (an oar) and the other
 sitting up and down ("hiking" as they
 call it) on the delicate outrigger as
 human ballast, every time the wind
 freshens or falls, the crew seem to
 be amphibious, for, if the "hiker"
 chances to miss stays, as it were, by
 failing to move quickly enough to pre-
 serve the equilibrium of the craft, over
 she goes and the men, particularly if
 air tanks exist at the interchangeable
 stem and stern, as they do on all
 modern-built proas, topple into the sea
 and, holding on respectively fore and
 aft, "unhitch" the lug sail, set the
 light boat "on its feet," ball her out,
 slide aboard over the sharp ends, and
 away she goes like greased lightning
 through the eddying mist.

The proa is the reverse in model
 of any pleasure craft in the country;
 the hull is not symmetrical, the sides
 being unequal and of different form.
 The leeward side is flat from stem
 to stern and acts as a keelboard or con-
 trolboard, while the windward is round-
 ed, as in other boats. The outrigger,
 usually about ten feet long, has at-
 tached at its outer end a miniature boat,
 a dainty replica, six feet in length, of
 the parent craft. When the proa is
 sailing on an even keel it is not an
 impediment to speed, and when on the
 wind it is sometimes tilted upward to
 an angle of 45 degrees, but a move-
 ment outward of a foot or more of the
 "hiker" causes it to reach the water,
 throwing upward and around dainty
 specks of foam, which, blended with
 those dashed from the bow of the fast-
 sailing proa, produces a mist that en-
 folds both crafts sometimes, so dense
 as to render them invisible.

RATS NOT FOND OF TOBACCO.

They Avoid the Weed in All Its
 Forms

"I noticed that rat story told in the
 Star by Colonel L. S. Brown, of the
 Southern Railway recently," said an
 avenue tobacco dealer to a Washing-
 ton star man, "and I want to say that
 any tobacco man can put in a good
 word for the rat, but I suppose he is
 about the only man who would say
 anything about the rodent family that
 was good. Besides, what he says is a
 negative sort of goodness. The rat
 simply doesn't bother the tobacco man.
 During a long experience in the to-
 bacco business, an experience covering
 twenty-five years or more, I can recall
 only a few instances where the rat be-
 came at all bothersome around a cigar
 store. They cannot stand the odor of
 tobacco, and I have never known of
 rats eating tobacco in any form or
 even of rats attempting to cut into to-
 bacco. I suppose the taste of the weed
 is offensive to the rodent palate. At
 any rate they will have nothing to do
 with it.

"You might fill this place up with
 rats and I would open every box of
 cigars and tobacco in the place so the
 tribe could have access to the stock,
 and I would lay a wager we could
 come in here after they had remained
 overnight and find they had not
 touched a thing in the place. Rats are
 not chewers, nor smokers, nor users of
 the weed. Even the smoke of tobacco
 seems to craze them.

"I remember a few years ago of hav-
 ing made an experiment to see what
 effect smoke would have on the rat. I
 had caught a rat in a trap at my home.
 I put him in a little cage and began to
 blow tobacco smoke in on him. I have
 seen a great many panic-stricken ani-
 mals, but nothing in my experience
 equaled the wild alarm of that rat
 when I began to puff the smoke
 through the slits of the cage. If the
 cage had been on fire he would not
 have been more frightened than he
 was. I carried the experiment further
 than I had intended, for before I knew
 it the rat became as limp as a rag and
 was evidently very much nauseated.
 The experiment taught me that the
 rat's stomach rebels at either the smell
 or taste of tobacco and I suppose that's
 why we are not pestered by rats in
 cigar stores."
