



No one has any wish to quarrel with the quickening interests which have come into women's lives, but it is certain that if all the women in the future are too busy to attend to the things that are without money and without price, if they are to be harried and hurried over the things of the world, the whole of life will have become incomparably the porer.

"There are three ways in which women are pre-eminent: They are the binders together of society, they are the beautifiers of life, and they are the preservers of morals," said President Hazard of Wellesley in one of her addresses.

"And beauty born of murmuring sound shall pass into her face," wrote Emerson of his Lucy, and it is certain that one must first "absorb at the great natural reservoir and fountains of the beautiful before he himself can become truly beautiful in life and character and so able to transmit beauty to all around."—Kansas City Journal.

Millions Yearly for Golf. Few people are aware that some thing like fifty million dollars are spent yearly on the game of golf. To begin with, there are 870 golf clubs in England, 760 in the United States, 632 in Scotland, 134 in Ireland, 43 in Wales, and 63 in different parts of the continent. There are, all told, probably not less than 3,000 organizations devoted to golf playing.

These clubs, counting their grounds, buildings and preliminary expenses, represent a permanent investment of \$40,000,000 or \$50,000,000, and comparatively few of them can be run at a yearly expense of less than \$5,000. The average membership of a club is about 200 and the average yearly subscriptions of these 600,000 golf players amounts to nearly \$20,000,000. Each of the players is equipped with an outfit that costs on an average about \$20 and the yearly purchase of golf clubs. all over the world, amounts, therefore, to several millions of dollars.
