As required by the 5th section of an act of the Legislative Assembly of said Territory, entitled "An act to provide for taking the sense of the people for or against the formation of a State Government," passed December 12th, 1856, I have made the foregoing abstract of the votes "for and against Convention" and I do hereby certify that the same is correct and true, according to returns now on file in my office, and that there is a majority of five thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight votes in favor of convention to form a State constitution. Indian War Claims.
THE Commission appointed to examine and report upon the expenses incurred in the suppression of hostilities in the late Indian war in Oregon and Washington by the Territorial Governments of said Territories, hereby give notice that hereafter the board will concentrate its work at Vancouver, W. T., where all applications and communications touching its official duties may be made.

The labor of the Commission, under the law and the order organizing the board, are devoted to ascertaining and reporting the expenses necessarily incurred by the two Territories in suppressing Indian hostilities. Spoliation claims and claims for the loss of property during the war, not actually in the public service, cannot be entertained or passed upon. Claims of this kind can only be acted upon under further legislation of Congress.
