Indian War Claims. THE Commission appointed to examine and re-port upon the expenses incurred in the sup-pression of hostilities in the late Indian war in Or-

segon and Washington by the Territorial Govern-ments of said Territories, hereby give notice that hereafter the board will concentrate its work at Vencouver, W. T., where all applications and exampulications touching its official duties may

be made.

The labors of the Commission, under the law and the order organizing the board, are devoted to ascertaining and reporting the expenses necessarily incurred by the two Territories in suppressing Indian hostilities. Spoliation claims and claims for the loss of property during the war, not actually in the public service, cannot be entertained or passed upon. Claims of this kind can only be acted upon under further legislation of Congress.

Persons having claims yet unadjusted with the respective Territorial authorities should see to it that such claims be recognized by the proper departments of the late volunteer service, and presented through them to the commission.
