

persons on board the ship from any blame from the disaster. Another very important fact stated by Professor Morse, is that the cable was running out but very little faster than the rate at which the ship was going.

DISCIPLINE IN CHILDHOOD—Young people who have been habitually gratified in all their desires will infallibly take it more amiss when the feelings or happiness of others require that they should be thwarted than those who have been practically trained to the habit of restraining them; and consequently will, in general, sacrifice the happiness of others to their own selfish indulgence. To what else is the selfishness of princes and other great people to be attributed? It is vain to think of cultivating principles of generosity and beneficence by mere exhortation and reasoning.

Nothing but the practical habit of overcoming our selfishness, and of familiarly encountering privations and discomforts on account of others, will enable us to do it when required. And therefore, I am firmly persuaded that indulgence infallibly produces selfishness and hardness of heart, and that nothing but a pretty severe discipline and control can lay the foundation of a magnanimous character.—Lord Jeffrey.
