THE UPAS THEE .- The story that the Upas tree of Java exhales a paisonous proma, breathing which causes death, is now known to be false. The tree itself secretes a juice which is a deadly poison, but its proma or odor is harmless. Strychnine is made from the seeds of species of Upas tree. The story that there is a polioned valley in Java called the Upas Valley is true. Such is the name of a district the atmosphere of which produces death,-This effect is not occasioned by the Upas tree, but by an extinct volcano near Batar. called Guevo Upas. From the old crater and the adjoining valley is exhaled a carbonic gas, such as often extinguishes life in this country in old wells and foul places. This deadly atmosphere kills every created thing which comes within its range -birds, beasts and even men; and the valley is covered with skeletons. By a confusion of names the poisonous effects of this deadly valley have been ascribed to the Upas tree, the juice of which is poisonous, and hence the field in regard to the deadly Hohun Upus tree.

A Nice Point of Law. -I heard this ancedete from a gentleman long resident in Philadelphia. Two Quakers in that place field of Tray-rough with the dead bodies applied to their society, as they do not go to law, to decide in the following difficulty : A is uneasy about a ship that ought to have arrived, meets It, an insurer, and states his wish to have the vessel insured. The matter is agreed upon. A returns home, and receives a letter informing him of the loss of his ship. What shall he do ! He is afraid that the policy is not filled up, and should B hear of the matter soon it is all over with him; he therefore writes to B thus; " Friend B, if thee hasn't filled up the policy, thee needs't, for I've heard of the ship," "Ob, oh !" thinks B to himself, cunning fellow; "he wants to do me out of the premium." So he writes thus to A: "Friend A, three be'est too late by half an hour, the policy is filled." A rubs his hands with delight, yet B refuses to pay, Well, what is the decision? The loss is divided between them .- Essays Contributed to Blockwood's Magazine, by the Rev. John Eagles, M. A.

A New Plan -For preserving vegetable substances a patent has bitely been taken out in England by a genileman named Campbell. His general method of preserving vegetables is thus described .-In preserving posators they are first washed and pecled, as for ordinary use. They are then placed in a solution of salt and water for thirty minutes or there about, having been previously pierced all over. They are now placed in a vessel containing a solution of pearl barley, and 1-ft to simmer for about twenty minutes, after which they are taken out and left to cool. They are now broken or granulated into small particles, and placed on trays in a drying stove, at a temperature of about 110 deg. Fab., and when quite dry are packed in tins or casks for keeping. Carrots, cabbages, onions, turnips, cauliflowers; beans, peas, etc., are preserved by placing them in a solution of earbonate of soda and gum arable, in the proportion of about one ounce of the furmer to two ounces of the latter, in every gallon of water, while in a boiling state, and allowing them to remain for five minutes. Previous to this they are cut in slices and placed in a bag, and then dried in a similar manner as the potatoes and then packed ready for use.

A SECRET WORTH KNOWING - I tried rather a corious experiment with a few potatoes this scason. Some twelve months since I saw a letter from a farmer stating the great success that had attended an experiment the writer had made in the previone season. It consisted in inserting a peain each potato set, and planting the patato in the usual way. The result, he stated was a large yield of pens, and a splendid crop of po atoes; but the most important result was the entire freedom of the potatoes so treated from any disease, while all those planted in the usual way in the same field were extensively deteriorated. I was by this statement to try the experiment on a small scale in my own garden this season. I planted not quite half a prek, only fifty sets, in six ranks, curing a piece out of each, and putting a pen firmly in. The pen grew up and flourished well, and last week I dog the potatoes. They were perfeetly free from the slightest taint or speck of disease, and very time and large; while in the same bed close to them was another lot planted in the old style, nearly balf of which were rotten .- Agricultural Gazette.
