Napolcon and the Bible.

How true it is that adversity is often found to be the most potent remedy for the diseases of the soul !

However the opinion of men may differ as to the real conversion of the great Napoleon to a "living faith" in the Savior of man, the following well authenticated incidents of his closing life in dreavy exile, furnish a profitable theme for the contemplation of all. That the thoughts of this mighty hero of a hundred well-fought fields were first directed to the study of the Bible, during his banishment in St. Helens, can hardly be doubted.

Soon after his banishment in this dreary isle, an eminent Chistian of England, Rev. Dr. David Bogue, impressed with the belief that the religion of Christ could afford the most effective solace to his adversity, sent to the prisoner a copy of his Essay on the Divine Authority of the New Testament.

Napoleon read it; and the effect of it was strikingly evinced in the course of a conversation subsequently held between between the Emperor and his friend, General Bertrand, who accompanied him in his exile. Bertrand, perceiving that the divinity of Christ was fast gaining access to the mind of Napoleon, and being himself an infidel, addressed him in these words :

"I cannot conceive, Sire, how a great man like you can believe that the Supreme Being ever exhibited himself to men under a human form, with a body, a face, mouth, and eyes. Let Jesus be whatever you please-the highest intelligence, the purest heart, the most profound legislator, and in all respects the most singular being who has ever existed. I grant it. Still he was simply a man who taught his disciples, and deluded credulons popple, as did Orpheus, Confucius, and Brahma.

"Jesus caused himself to be adored, because his predecessors, Isls and Osiris, Jupiter and Juno, had proudly made themselves objects of worship. The ascendency of Jesus over his time was like the ascendency of the gods and heroes of fable. If Jesus has impassioned and attached to his chariot the multitude-if he has revolutionized the world-1 see in that only the power of genius, the action of a commanding spirit, which vanquishes the world, as so many conquerors have done-Alexander, Casar, you, Sire, and Mohammed, with a sword.

To this appeal of Bertrand, Napoleon replied in a strain of eloquence every syllable of which burned with the power of truth in vindication of the position he had taken. In the course of that reply, he said :

"I know men, and I tell you that Jesus Christ is not a man. Superficial minds see a resemblance between Christ and the founders of empires and the gods of other religions. That resemblance does not exist. There is between Christianity and whatever other religion the distance of infinity. No! I summon entire Olympus to my tribunal. I judge the gods, but am very far from prostrating myself before their vain images. The gods, the legisla-ters of India and of China, of Rome and of Athens, have nothing which can overawe me.

"It is not so with Christ. Everything in him astonishes me. His spirit overawes me, and his will confounds me. His birth, and the history of his life; the profundity of his doctrine, which grapples the mightiest difficulties (showing that he had been no superficial student,) and which is of those difficulties the most admirable solu his apparition, his empire, his march across the ages and the realms-everything is, for me, a prodigy, a mystery insoluble, which plunges me into a reverie from which I cannot escape-a mystery which is there before my eyes-a mystery which I can neither deny nor explain. Here I see nothing human. You speak of Casar, of Alexander ; of their conquests, and of the enthusiasm which they enkindled in the hearts of their soldiers. But can you conceive of a dead man making conquests. with an army faithful, and entirely devoted te his memory ? My armies have forgotten mes even while living, as the Carthagenian army forgot Hannibal. Such is our power! A single battle lost crushes us, and adversity scatters our friends. "Can you conceive of Crear, as the eternal Emperor of the Roman Senate, and from the depth of his mausoleum governing the empire? Such is the history of the invasion and conquest of the world by Christianity. Nations pass away, thrones crumble, but the church remains. What is, then, the power which has protected this church thus assailed by the furious billows of rage and the hostility of ages ! Whose is the arm which, for eighteen bundred years, has protected the church from so many storms which have threatened to engulf it ! Alexander, Cresar, Charlemagne, and myself, founded empires. But upon what did we rest the creations of our genius ? Upon force. Jesus Christ alone founded his empire on love, and at this hour millions of men would die for him." May we not exclaim, in view of the above, how trifling and unworthy of consideration are the blasphemous emanations of lesser minds against the truth of religion, when it requires but an honest examination of the subject to wrest such confessions from a mind as great as Napoleon's!-Philadel phia Press. CORRECT SPEAKING .- We advise all young people to acquire in early life the babit of using good language, both in speaking and writing, and to abandon as early as possible any use of slang words and phrases. The longer they live the more difficult the acqusition of such language will be; and if the golden age of youth, the proper season for the acquisition of language be passed in its abuse, the unfortunate victim of neglected education is very probably doomed to talk slang for life. Money is not necessary to procure this education. Every man has it in his power. He has and examine for yourselves his splendid and select merely to use the language which he reads instead of the slang which he hears; to form his taste from the best speakers and poets of the country ; to treasure up choice phrases in his memory, and habituate himself to their use-avoiding at the same time that pedantic precision and bombast, which show rather the weakness of vain ambition than the polish of an educated mind.
