AS ORDERED by the Commissioners of a Clackamas county, acting in pursuance of an act of the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Oregon passed January 20th, 1858, entitled "An act to amend an act to provide for the sale of common school lands of the Territory of Oregon," such portions of the school lands in said county as the state of the public surveys will permit will be publicly offered for sale to the highest bidder at Oregon City on the Saturdays following the first Mondays of September, December, April, and July, not more than 150 acres in one lot.
