Ma Russell -Some of the Northern INSTRUCTION IN MUSIC. On the one side stand the porters of constitutional government these who favor the preservation of free institutions—those who dread military despotism—those who believe in the noble principles of Anglo-Saxon reedom, that have made England what it is; and on the other side are those who prefer a military government, founded on treachery and conspiracy—those who would suppress the press and all the other noble results that fow from its freedom-those who regard African slavery as a divine institution, to be fostered by the government at the expease of every other branch of industry in the State. A NUT FOR PEACE MEN AND COMPROMIsens .- Hon. John J. Crittenden and eveof other Representative from Kentucky, except Burnett, voted for army and navy supplies, thus favoring a prosecution of the war. Further: Crittenden introduced a resolution declaring that the war was forced upon the Government by Southern disunionists, and it passed with but two dissentient votes.

GEN. SHIELDS ON THE WAR .-- In a Fourth of July oration, delivered by Gen. Shields, at Columbia, California, he said:

"The North wishes to regain, protect, take and hold and preserve the public in-stitutions and property which belong to our posterity. If any one refuses or does not feel willing to perform his daty, he is not worthy of this country, and ought not to be allowed to reside in it."

Overland Matt. - The daily line from Sacramento to St. Joseph employs 2,000 horses and about 400 stages and wagons, The stations are twelve miles apart, and there have been established up to this time from 135 to 150 of them. At each of these stations a dinner or a breakfast can be obtained, and at most of them a tired passenger can find a bed. The privilege of stopping at any station over one stage, is secured to each passenger.
