John Maynard was well known in the lake district as a God-fearing, honest, intelligent pilot. He was a pilot on a steamer from Detroit to Buffelo one summer afternoon. At that time those steamers seldom carried boats. Smoke was seen ascending from below, and the captain called out 'Simpson, go down and see what that smoke is.' Simpson came up, with his face pale as ashes, and said, 'Captain, the ship is on fire! Then 'Fire! fire! fire! fire!' on ship-board. All hands were called up. Buckets of water were dashed upon the fire, but in vain. There were large quantities of rosin and tar on board, and it was useless to attempt to save the ship. The passengers rushed forward and inquired of the pilot, 'How far are we from Buffalo?' 'Seven miles.' 'How long before we reach it?' 'Three-quarters of an honr, at our present rate of steam." 'Is there any danger?' 'Danger heresee the smoke bursting out! go forward, if you would save your lives! Passengers and crew, men, women and children, crowded the forward part of the ship. John Maynard stood at the helm.

The flames burst forth in a sheet of fire; clouds of smoke arose; the captain cried out through his trumpet, 'John Maynard!' 'Ave, ave, sir!' 'Are you at the helm!' 'Aye, aye, sir!' 'How does she head?' 'Southeast-by-east, sir.' 'Head her southeast, and run her on shore.' Nearer, nearer, yet nearer she approached the shore. Again the captain cried out, 'John Maynard!' The response came feebly, 'Aye, aye, sir!' 'Can you hold on five minutes longer?" 'By God's help, I will!" The old man's hair was seorched from the scalp; one hand disabled, his knee upon the stanchion, and his teeth set, with his other hand upon the wheel, he stood firm as a rock. He beached the ship-every man, woman, and child, was saved, as John Maynard dropped, and his spirit took its flight to his God!

PAY OF SOLDIERS INCREASED .- By an Act of Congress recently passed, the soldier's pay is increased from eleven to fifteen dollars per month, and the pay of non-commissioned officers is increased in proportion. To the late three months troops a bounty of thirty dollars per man is offered if they re-calist for the war individually; forty dollars if they re-enlist by regiments.
