Law School.

IF A NUMBER OF PUPILS SUFFICIENT to warrant the undertaking can be obtained, the undersigned will open a LAW SCHOOL in the town of ALBANY, Oregon, commencing the first Monday in December, or sooner, if a class shall be made up before that time. The design of the school is to afford a complete course of legal education for the profession in any of the United States, except in matters of mere local law and practice; and the instruction will embrace the various branches of the Common Law, and of Equity, Admiralty, Commercial, International, and Constitutional Law, and the Jurisprudence of the United States.

Instruction will be given by oral lectures, when deemed necessary, and there will be daily recitations and examinations upon the text. The course of studies will be arranged so as to be completed in two academic years of forty weeks each. The year will be divided into two terms, with a vacation at the end of each term. The tuition fee will be \$120 for the academic year.

For the best dissertation, a prize will be awarded annually by one of the Judges of the Circuit Court and by two members of the Bar, chosen for the purpose.
