

Berry Clay on Retention.
"If any one State, or any portion of the people of any State, choose to place themselves in array against the Government of the Union, I am for trying the strength of this Government, I am for ascertaining whether we have a Government or not—practicable, efficient, capable of maintaining its authority and upholding the powers and interests which belong to a Government.—Now, sir, as I to be advised, or informed from our stock course by Intimations of the splitting of blood. If blood is to be split, by whose hands is it to be split? Upon the supposition, I understand, it will be the joints of those who know to raise the standard of division, and endeavor to prevent the Government. And, sir, when that is done, so long as it pleases God to give me a power to express my sentiments or avow, make and enforce as it may be by age, that voice and that will be on the side of my country, for the support of the general authority, and for the maintenance of the Powers of the Union.—(Speech of Henry Clay, August 1st, 1850.)
