

MORE CHIVALRIC MANIFESTATIONS.—In one of the naval actions of the Mississippi a rebel boat was so severely injured that her crew took to the water. Boats were instantly lowered from one of our vessels, and our gallant tars pulled their best at the oars to save their helpless enemy.

At the battle on the White river, Ark., one of our boats received a shot in her hull, and her crew were driven overboard by the escaping steam. A correspondent who writes from the scene of the action, confirms the report which came first by telegraph, that the rebels turned their guns upon our helpless men in the water; it seems they did even more than this. After firing the guns of their upper and lower battery upon the struggling men, the rebels, it is stated, sent a detachment of sharpshooters from their place to a point on the river, whence they fired at better advantage upon those who had not yet sunk. And, determined to make their inhumanity perfect, they lastly fired upon the boats which were sent to rescue the drowning crew—both great guns and sharpshooters firing at the boats engaged in this work.

Judge Breckinridge of Missouri—a Bell-Everett Unionist, and a member of the Convention—lately had occasion, in addressing that body, to say:

"I think I may say that, without any opinion on this subject that would justify the charge, there is not to be found in the State of Missouri a single man of marked loyalty who has not already been denounced as an Abolitionist, when, in point of fact, he is as far removed from them as he is in thought or sympathy from those who prefer the charge. This charge has been so often and so flippantly made, that I have come to consider it as, perhaps, the most unfeeling test of a man's loyalty, that he has been denounced as an Abolitionist. That man who has been so successful in tempering his loyalty throughout this struggle as to avoid incurring the hostility of the class engaged in treason, and their sympathizers, to such an extent as not to incur the application of that epithet, I will not say he is not loyal, but I will say his loyalty has, in all probability, not borne any very distinguished fruits."

The New York *Tablet*, the Catholic organ, in a letter, styled "highly important from Rome," has the following paragraph:

"On the same steamer with the above mentioned Bishops were several ecclesiastics from far distant countries—one in particular I must mention—The Bishop of Senegal, West Coast of Africa, who brings with him two full-blooded Africans—negroes—yes, genuine, black negroes, who are to finish their philosophical and theological education at the College of the Propaganda, Rome. This fact I learned from a passenger who arrived by the same steamer. Is there a College in New England, or any part of the States, that would allow a negro to study within its walls? Rome knows no distinction on account of color, between the children of Adam."
