

A great sensation has been recently created in England by an ecclesiastical trial before the Court of Arches, which has again furnished the proof, that the established church of England is in a more humiliating position than any other state church of Europe. Two of the authors of the famous "Essays and Reviews," Dr. Williams and Dr. Wilson, having been accused of heresy, the judge, a layman, took with great emphasis the position that the Court in the name of the state had the right and the duty to demand of all the ministers of the church a strict conformity to the letter of the Thirty-nine Articles.—The question of what is or is not conformity to the dead letter of the articles, and, therefore, what is the official doctrine of the church, has thus been taken entirely out of the hands of the church, and is in every case to be decided by an officer of the state. The Judge expressly stated that the condemnation of the "Essays" by the English Bishops had no weight whatever with the Court. The *Inquirer* of London, welcomes "this clear and impartial decision as proving incontrovertibly that the established church, as now constituted, is no place for free men."

The last days of slavery are drawing very near. The invasion of free Middle and West-ru States seals its doom, and we may look now for general confiscation wherever the Union armies march. Six months hence there will not be a slave in the Southern States, save where they are kept in servitude by armed rebels.

Persons owning farms on the outskirts of Washington have been notified by the Government to gather their crops, so as to make room for the troops that are expected there.

The Jews of Chicago held a meeting and resolved to raise an Israelite company for the war. These persons subscribed \$8,000 to help along enlistments.
