

SHABBING AFFRAY AND DEATH.—On Tuesday afternoon last, an affray occurred in the store of B. Hughes, in this place, wherein a man named Moran (known as Jack Moran) was terribly cut by Wm. Stricklin, a resident of the county, from the effects of which he died the same night.

The affray appeared to have grown out of a difficulty which had taken place a few days previous at a horse race a few miles in the country.

On the next day, a preliminary examination was held before Justice Hurlford, when Stricklin was bound over for his appearance at the next term of the Circuit Court, in the sum of \$5,000. Septimus Huclat appeared for the State, and A. E. Wait for the defendant. The soreties on the bond are Messrs. Balston & Myers and Louis Behrens, and perhaps one or two others.

Without referring to the merits of the case, either to create sympathy or prejudice against Mr. Stricklin, who is an old man and is to have an impartial trial before a jury of his countrymen, we may yet be permitted to say that the use, much more the abuse, of such weapons as knives and pistols in our community deserves the severest reprobation.

Even the carrying of such deadly weapons in a community where law and order reign, is an insult to the law,—which is designed for the protection of all—and to the sense of justice and right, which is surely paramount in the hearts of our community.
