ROSECBANS.

Nashville, Jan. 5 .- From persons arriving from the battle field we learn that on Saturday night, during the storm, the rebels attacked our men in the rifle pits along the whole line. There was heavy fighting in the centre. We finally succeeded in driving the rebels across Stone river. The 7th Pennsylvania, 3d Ohio and 8th Indiand first carried their defenses. On Sunday morning Stanley's brigade entered Murfreesboro. The town is considerably

injured by shells. Headquarters, Department of the Cumberland, Jan. 5 .- To Gen. Hulleck: We have fought one of the greatest battles of the war, and are victorious. Our entire success on the 31st was prevented by the surprise of our right flank. We have, nevertheless, beaten them after a three days fight. They fled in great confusion on Saturday night last, and their cavalry column left this morning. Their loss was very heavy. Gens, Rains and Hanson were killed, and Gens. Adams, Breckinridge, and Gladson wounded.

Terrible Fighting at Vicksburg!

Memphis, Jan. 1 .- Dispatches from Gen Sherman on the battle-field of Vicksburg were received at Helena, Ark., on the 29th. Gen. Sherman landed his force on the left bank of the Yazoo, 10 miles above its mouth, and, forming in line of battle, he advanced toward Vicksburg. After passing a point within reach of the fire of the gunboats, he encountered the enemy in force. A terrific conflict ensued. The enemy were driven back beyond two bayous that girt the rear of Vicksburg, and from their entrenched works and one hill by shells.
