

ONE OF THE IRON CLADS—A second trial trip of the Monitor Passaic was lately made at New York. She carries two guns, an eleven-inch and a fifteen-inch, the latter the largest gun probably ever carried by a vessel of war. At its muzzle the thickness of the cast is about five inches, but the breech is more than four feet thick. In consequence of the great size of the gun it was thought if an aperture was made in the turret large enough to run out the muzzle there would be great danger of the enemy's shells entering. Therefore the port was made but little larger in diameter than the bore of the gun, so that it served as a continuation of the cannon, the ball but not the muzzle being able to pass through. The gun was tried with a full charge of powder of thirty-five pounds, and the ball thrown was 450 pounds. The concussion was very great, but to lessen it apertures are left in the floor of the turret, communicating with the "hold," so that the shock goes below and relieves the turret to that extent. The speed of the vessel was not so great as the contract required, seventy-two revolutions per minute. She made only sixty.
