It is printed on a large sheet, twenty-seven by forty-two inches, and is furnished at the low price stated below.

It will contain all the original matter of the *National Republican*, with the exception of local news not interesting to country subscribers. It will give full reports of the proceedings of Congress, and of other departments of the national Government. It will contain all the news of the day, foreign and domestic, markets, etc., as well as original correspondence from all parts of the country, and, in all respects, the effort will be made to establish the character of the *National Republican* as a Family Newspaper.

Washington being now the central point of the current military operations, great attention will be paid to furnishing the readers of the *National Republican* with full and especially with accurate, accounts of the progress of the war for the Union.
