RECIPE FOR SCARLET FEVER.—One grain of sulphate of zinc, pulverized together, with a very little white sugar; then add four ounces of water. Dose for an adult, (one-third the quantity for a child,) one table spoonful every half hour until the disease has vanished. By the fourth dose the patient will be quite warm, the moist, and every symptom very favorable, as medical men have it when the disease is mastered. Any volatile liniment will remove all soreness of the throat.
