

MUCH WORK WADONE

THE SENATE CONFIRMED ITSELF STRICTLY TO BUSINESS.

Postoffice Appropriation Bill Was Passed and Much Progress Was Made With Agricultural Bill.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 15.—The senate confirmed itself strictly to business today, and as a result passed the postoffice appropriation bill and got half through the agricultural bill. Efforts were resumed to cut down rentals for postal cars and for the Eastern fast mail service north and south, but all these amendments were defeated by decisive majorities. Secretary Morton was present during the debate on the agricultural appropriation bill. It brought out an animated discussion of the proposition to amend the meat inspection system, in order to get American meat into foreign countries. During the day the pooling bill was taken up long enough to permit a speech in its support by Butler, in charge of the bill. Butler, in his speech in support of the railroad pooling bill, said the headlines of Chandler's speech in the Congressional Record, referring to a gigantic political partnership, "the partnership with the railroads," was a "gigantic political partnership." Butler offered the opinion of experts showing a saving out of \$100,000,000 of railroad traffic only \$50,000,000 would be pooled if this bill passed.

The Butler resolution was then laid aside and the postoffice appropriation bill was taken up. Several amendments were presented and a House bill was sought to have the subsidy of \$120,000, now given to the Eastern fast line, north and south, divided with a similar fast line running west through Oregon, Kentucky, Tennessee, Georgia, Mississippi, Louisiana, and Texas. Call added Florida. Both amendments were laid on the table, 31 to 21, and the postoffice appropriation bill was then passed without opposition.

The agricultural appropriation bill was taken up. The proposed amendment to the meat inspection law occasioned some discussion. Call said the present inspection laws were being invaded, numerous dealers were sending meat goods abroad labeled as having passed government inspection, when no such inspection had occurred. Platt declared this was a covert plan to make a whole extension of the meat inspection law, and that it could not be justified as a means of reconciling Germany. Arizona Anxious for Statehood. PHOENIX, Ariz., Feb. 15.—At a meeting this evening of republicans from every portion of the territory strong resolutions were adopted in favor of immediate statehood under any of the plans now suggested in congress. Resolutions were telegraphed this evening to Senator Doolittle, at Washington, especially soliciting the support of all republican senators. The signers comprise every republican member of the legislature, Delegate-Elect Murphy, and the most prominent members of the republican territorial central committee.

The Survey of Port Orford. WASHINGTON, Feb. 15.—The chief engineers submitted to the house today a report of the preliminary survey of Port Orford, Ore., for the purpose of making it a harbor of refuge. The report says that Port Orford could not be made a harbor of refuge. Two seawalls could be built at a cost of \$200,000, but it is not plain that the harbor would be improved to any great extent, for the proposed seawalls would not, by reason of the topography, be well suited for commercial operations.

Additional Judge for This District. WASHINGTON, Feb. 15.—The house today passed a bill, by unanimous consent, for an additional judge in the ninth (Pacific slope) judicial district. The principal candidates for the additional judgeship are Judge Ross, present judge of the Southern California district, and Judge Wallace, judge of the superior court, of San Francisco. Senator White is supporting Ross. United States District Judge Bellinger, of Oregon, is also mentioned.

A Reference to Be Appointed. NEW YORK, Feb. 15.—An application for a reference in the suit of the heirs of Jay Gould to obtain exemption from taxation of certain personal property, inherited under the will of the late millionaire, was granted today by Judge Barrett in the supreme court, who will appoint a referee in the matter in a few days. The hearing will perhaps be in five months' duration.

Unaffiliated Chiefs to Visit Washington. WASHINGTON, Feb. 15.—Senator Mitchell has secured permission from the department for A. L. Rumburg, of Athens, to bring three Unaffiliated chiefs to Washington to talk over affairs affecting that reservation.

ON HIS WAY HOME. Hoffman, One of the Elbe Survivors, in Omaha. OMAHA, Feb. 15.—Carl A. Hoffman, of Grand Island, one of the 20 persons saved from the wreck of the Elbe in the North sea, arrived here this morning. He came from Chicago at 5:50 this morning, and spent the day calling on his friends and left for his home at 2:15 this afternoon. He said: "I could have been home before, had I wanted to; but I cannot bear to go home and think that my wife and child will be alone. I will then make a sworn statement and forward it to the owners of the Elbe. I do not think it best that I talk too much about the action of the officers and the behavior of the Catholic."

CAUSE OF THE FAILURE

WHY THERE HAS BEEN NO FINANCIAL LEGISLATION.

President Cleveland's Friends Relied Too Much Upon His Party and Ignored the Republicans.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 16.—(Oregonian Office, Corcoran Building.)—Mr. Cleveland's friends in congress who have been endeavoring to secure financial legislation have made the mistake from the first of trying to secure a compliance with his views by party means. Knowing from the first that in order to secure legislation it was necessary to have the major portion of the strength to carry it through from the republicans, the democratic friends of the president have ignored the republicans in the preparation and management of the propositions. Republicans who endeavored to secure more recognition for their views, which they wished to make a part of the legislation, were refused. Republicans in connection with measures to retire the greenbacks or to strengthen the treasury, desired also to make provision for necessary money to carry on the government to correct by increased tariff the fiscal errors of the Wilson bill. All such appeals have been met with the statement that the tariff was a part measure, and that the democratic would not consent to have anything to do with it.

It was as well known as anything could be that the big bond scheme could not pass at the end of congress. In fact, it appeared that the opposition in the senate, with the short time intervening before adjournment, would be powerful enough to prevent action. What the next move was, the friends of the president did not know. It will no doubt provide for the treasury, and will probably couple with a proposition for the relief of the treasury, some means for sufficient revenue. That is said to be the republican policy.

The subscribers for the last bond issue find themselves with bonds at a rate less than 3 per cent. interest, and 10-year bonds at that. The new bond issue is for 30 years, and interest at 3%. It is claimed that the men who took the last \$50,000,000 issue are very angry, and think they have been deceived. Cleveland's policy of buying gold as long as he can sell bonds, and as long as he can sell bonds at a rate as high as 5 per cent, which is the rate with the 3%, he can no doubt get gold. Every purchaser believes that gold bonds will be paid in gold or the equivalent. It is never for a moment contemplated that the obligations of the government would be repudiated. That argument is a desperate one to enter the minds of men who were making such a serious onslaught against the gold stipulation in the bond proposition, which Cleveland presented.

Representative Hermann secured the restoration of the pension of Allen Huddell, who was a soldier in the Civil war. The old soldier had been reduced without any evidence to one-half his original ratings.

Senator Mitchell has had passed a resolution calling on the secretary of war for all reports of the local engineers in charge of the work as to surveys and other matters taken up by the engineers of the appropriation contained in the last river and harbor bill of \$100,000, for improving the Columbia river, Oregon and Washington.

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THE EX-QUEEN'S TRIAL

LILUOKALANI WILL PROBABLY BE FOUND GUILTY.

It Is Thought, However, That the Young Republic Will Extend to Her Executive Clemency.

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 15.—The steamer Mariposa arrived this morning, bringing the following advices from Honolulu under date of February 5: Liluokalani, the ex-queen of Hawaii, was arraigned February 3 on a charge of misprision of treason. The deposed monarch, who is represented by Paul Neumann, refused to plead, so a plea of not guilty was entered. The timony of the witnesses sufficed to prove to an impartial observer that she was aware of the rebellion and that she was not a passive observer. The direct examination was confined to an alleged conversation between her and Charles Clark, who testified that he had informed her of the proposed rebellion, but she denied that any such conversation took place. After her examination was concluded, a statement written by her was filed. It commences with a story from the time she was deposed, and goes on to say:

"The movement undertaken by the Hawaiians last month was absolutely commenced without my knowledge, sanction, consent or assistance, directly or indirectly, and this fact is, in truth, well known to those who took part in it. I received no information from any one in regard to the movement, and I am sure that no man who was induced, or to be induced, to join in any such uprising, I do not know why this information should be withheld from me, unless it was with a view to my personal safety or as a precautionary measure. It would not have received my sanction, and I can assure the gentlemen of this commission that I am not a party to such action. I would have dissuaded the promoters from such a venture. But I will add that, had I known, their secrets would have been known to me, and I would have been a party to them."

"That I intended to conceal my cabinet and to appoint certain officers of the kingdom in the event of my restoration, I will admit, but that I, or anyone known to me, had any intention of doing so, I do not know.
