They were using for the 67-ton guns a powder which was quite unsuk-able, and he said: "That powder will blow the breechplece off." The mandarin nodded, smiled and answared: "Yes, it does." The last time the gun was fired, he said, it killed 14 men, so then they loaded another gun and fired it, and that time 24 men were killed.
