



# NEW YORK STOCK MARKET.

Considerable Speculative Activity on the Part of the Bears.

NEW YORK, Jan. 11 .- Today's stock market was characterized by considerable speculative activity on the part of the bear contingent. The raid, however, was restricted to a small num ber of stocks all of them in the list of what are called apecialties, including the New York city public utilities and the older high-priced idustrials. There was positive demoralization in these active stocks, in contrast to the fairly firm underione of the general list, and es-pecially the rallroads. The occasion of the at-tack on the industrials was, of course, yesterday's utterances by the possident of the Amet ioan Sugar Refining Company. The friends o other stocks in the industrial firt made strems ous efforts to differentiate their movement from that of Sugar, and marked them up briskly at the opening, in the face of the violent break in the opening, in the stock list, but the bears met these maneuvers by selling in such volume and onfidence that one after apother of the epeclaities crumbled in price and fell through a storm of dislodged stop-loss orders.
