

A better tone to the wheat market
brought and commanding higher prices

The market remains almost stationary. Business is of very fair volume, but mostly on extremely conservative lines, and there is little or nothing more than ordinary inquiry from exporters or buyers. Prices remain virtually as quoted for several days, being fairly firm for choice goods, but otherwise rather soft.

WOOL—There is not enough old wool in the state to make much of a market at the present time, but there is a very good feeling, and prospects are quite bright for excellent prices. New York
