Origin of "Lead, Kindly Light." There has long been a controversy over be question whether Cardinal Newman's beautiful and popular "Lead, Kindly Light" is a Catholic or Protestant hymn. It has been asserted that it was written to describe "the rest and peace he found in joining the Roman Catholic church." A corespondent of the Christian Register definitely settles the dispute. He shows that Newman went to Italy in December, 1832, Failing sick in Sicily, he returned to England in 1833, and it was during his England in 1833, and it was during his voyage upon the Mediterranean in that year that he wrote the hymn. Cardinal Newman himself, in a letter written in that year, says: "I was aching to get home, yet for want of a vessel was kept at Palermo for three weeks. At last I got off on an orange boat bound for Marseilles. We were becalmed a whole week in the Straits of Bonifacio. There it was in the Straits of Bonifacio.
