

NEW YORK, May 17 .- The demand for rail oad stocks, which has given strength to the read stocks, which has given strength to the market for a number of days must, has been satisfied, and prices fell back today in that department of the stock list. But all of these stories were heard with hadguid inferest and prices continued to droop. In the industrial list the boses in prices were not such a passive matter. American Tobacco was under severe pressure all day on account of formidable competition. The stock lost over 6 points, classing at the lowest. Supar suffered from reports that the trade-wer was to assume a more acute sings. Fro-ple's Gas was under continued pressure by the professional element among the trades.
