

COMMERCIAL STOCK AND FINANCIAL NEWS

With the exception of the grain trade, which is now taking on its usual "summer" hue, business was of very good proportions yesterday. There is a slight upward movement on the part of the month, and the country business was exceptionally heavy yesterday. Produce receipts were heavy, but in many cases prices ruled rather firm. Strawberries came in pretty freely, and good shipping stock sold up around \$1.50 and \$1.75 per crate, with cream stock going down to \$1.25 to \$1.50 per crate. Growers who sold from wagons on the street did not average much above 40c and 50c per crate. Chickens are slightly scarce, and 60c net, clean up, as well as was expected for Friday. Eggs sold at all kinds of prices, round lots changing hands at 10c, while single crates were offering at 12c and 14c.

PORTLAND MARKETS. Grain, Flour, Etc. For the first time in weeks, Argentine shipments of less than 1,000,000 bushels were reported yesterday. An improvement in the crop situation at home and an improvement in the war situation abroad more than offset the increase which this decrease might have had on the market, and prices were generally lower. In the Portland market there is no little doing that it is difficult to quote accurate prices.
