Says the East Was Watching Oregon's Election With Unusual Interest-Canal Will Be Built.

Senator Joseph Simon reached home yesterday morning from Washington City. He was a busy man from the time he arrived at his office until office bours were over. Numerous friends, both personal and political, were anxious to see the Senator. Some of them waited for an hour or more for their turns to come. Mr. Simon gave each a patient hearing, and although looking tired in the afternoon, he received the last caller as peasantly as he had those of the

Some expressed surprise that Senator Simon did not remain East until after the National Republican Convention, in view of the fact that he was a delegate. He

of the fact that he was a delegate. He says that the reasons for his not remaining were purely of a business nature.

"In the first place," he said, "I was made a delegate without my knowledge. I advised my friends here upon learning of it that I should not remain for the convention if Congress adjourned before the convention met. Congress adjourned I ways before the appointed time for the convention to meet, and in justice to my business interests here I felt that I ought convention to meet, and in justice to my business interests here I felt that I ought to come on home. The convention will simply bel an indersement of President McKinley, the selection of a running mate and an adjournment. I did not think it necessary for me to stay away from my business here so long, simply to take part in that, when Oregon would be fully represented by good men.

"Washington and the entire East was as much interested in the returns from the Oregon election as our people here at home could have been, and when the news came that the state had gone more than 8000 our way there was great rejoicing among the Republicans. The Bernocrats and Populists had been watching for the results with as much interest as the Republicans had. Of course, they did not join in the rejoicing when the news came. Then, as the majority grew in size, their faces grew in length.

"There was especial gratification among the Republicans over the good vote that Mr. Tongue received. There was no fear about Mr. Moody, but some of them did not feel so sure about Tongue. Of course the Oregon delegation was highly pleased with the way his district fell into line."

Mr. Simon says that while all of the legislation in the Interest of Oregon was important, none was so much so as the appropriation of £50,000 for improvements at the mouth of the Columbia, which got through at the last moment.

"It took the unlied efforts of the Oregon delegation right up to the finish to get that through," said he. "And it did look as if it was not going through at all. We all knew how important it was and how anxious our people were to have the appropriation made, and none of us thought of giving up, though it did look bad for the measure. We were practically given to understand that it was out of the question, but we have the appropriation, all the same, for which we are duly thereful.

"The Pacific Coast delegations in Congress are making and will continue to make the same kind of a fight on getting the Nicaragua canal bill through. What

the Nicaragua canal bill through. What success they will meet with remains to be seen. The canal will be built; little doubt of that. It is now more a question of when. The people of the entire West are going to bring tremendous pressure to bear on this question, and will not stop until it is settled.

"The bill is scheduled to come before the House December 18. I think it is, and then the fight will begin to push it through. You will find few people in the West who do not heartly favor the building of the canal, and its importance is recognized by all thinking people all over the country. This being the case, it will be sure to be built, and the Coast will reap great benefits from it."
