Mr. William Archer, one of the best-known of British critics, declares in the London Morning Leader that Austin's activities are disturbing to the public peace and a menuce to amicable international relations Archer admits that Austin is "only too assiduously doing his best in the station to which malicious fate and a cynical Prime Minister called him." but "unfor-Prime Minister called nim, but uniot-tunately for his country a sense of humor has been denied him." Austin's persist-ent pipings, Mr. Archer affirms, make the British nation ridiculous, And from ridicule to contempt, and from contempt to hate, the steps are short and easy.

Mr. Archer reviews the history of the British laureateship and shows that from a court shecure it became, with Wordsworth and Tennyson a national institu-tion-a sucred trust with which Lord Saltion—a sucred trust with which Lord Sar-lisbury's contemptuous cynicism pallered. Austin was known to be hopelessly de-ficient in style, but he has proved still declared in fact, that essential qualmore deficient in tact, that essential quality of the laurente. "His want of style," says Mr. Archer, "humiliates us in our own eyes. His want of tact degrades us in the eyes of the world." Foreigners only know that Austin has succeeded to the laurel of Tennyson. "When they find him blustering in the center of the journalistic stage they may well ask what has become of the traditional directive of the

become of the traditional dignity of the English nation."

Austin's indiscreet deliverances upon foreign affairs, from the incredible folly of his "Jameson's Ride" and the danger-ous provocation of his verses upon the Fashoda affair, to his repeated impudent assumptions to speak for the people of the United States, are recited by Mr. Archer, who rightly dubs Austin "the hys-terical helot of imperialism." Austin seems to think hie strains may inspire Britons to battle as those of Tyrtaeus did the Spartans. But Tyrtaeus wrote before the days of the felegraph and the newspaper, and his verses were not read the next merning in the market places of Ithone, Argos and Athens. Tyrtaeus could there-fore safely say of Sparta's rivals, as Aus-

tin says of England's: Some fain would be her friend, and some w

clo? Its manner humiliates us. Austin lived in Chicago he probably could be suppressed under the comprehensive disorderly conduct section of our munici-pal code, but London seems without this remedy. Mr. Archer believes Austin is like the famous bagpiper of Bujalance who charged one maravedt for beginning and ten for leaving off. He suggests that Lord Salisbury atone for his bad loke by buying Austin off-give him a knighthood upon condition that he confine his poets effusions to royal christenings, "and, re far as foreign affairs are concerned, forth-with foin the Choir Inaudible." 
