BOTH NOMINATIONS UNANIMOUS. The Oregon Delegation Keenly Felt the Slight-Movements of the Oregonians in the East.

PHILADELPHIA, June 21.—President McKinley was unanimously renominated for President of the United States by the Republican National Convention at 1:18 o'clock today, and an hour and 10 minutes later Governor Roosevelt, of Ohio, was unanimously elected to stand beside him in the coming battle.

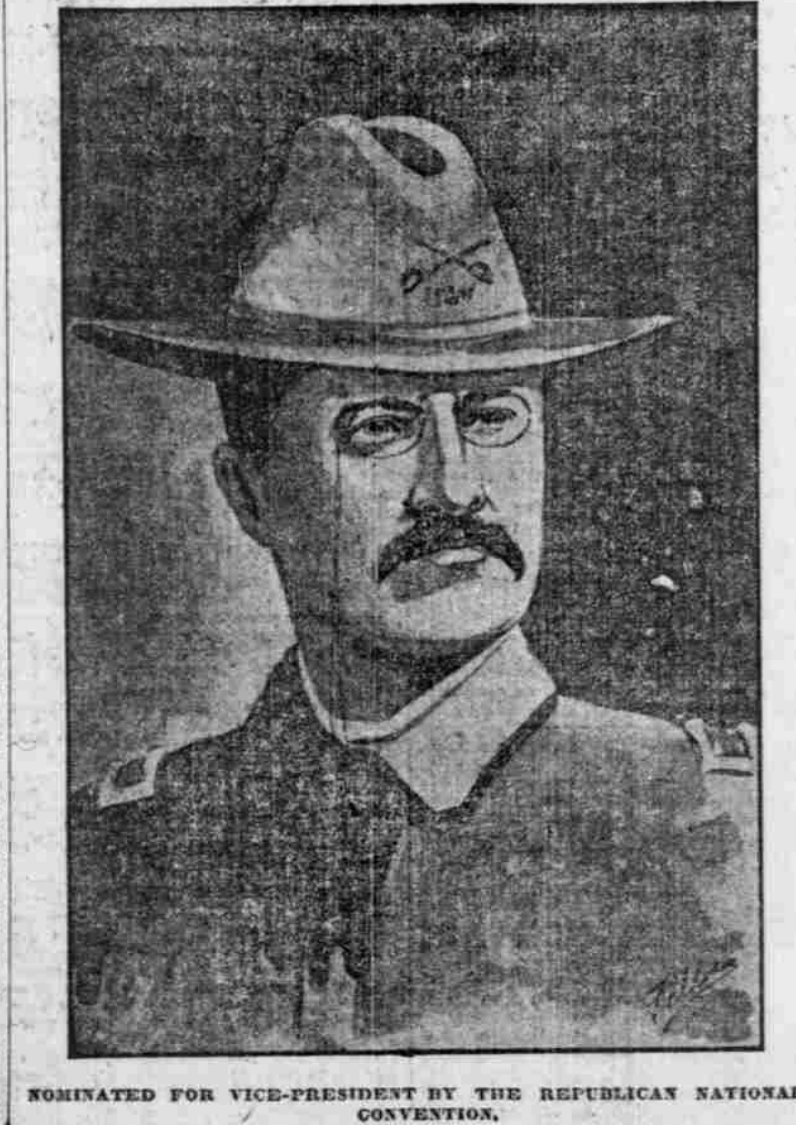
