



There were wide breaches in the prices, as the result of two days of semi-demoralisation on foreign stock markets, when the New York Stock Exchange Bargan trading this morning. American securi-ties dealt in in London were depressed all the way from a large fraction to 1% below the closing price here on Tuesday. British con-sols had lost all but 1-16 of a full point, and 6 per cent rontes had fallen 45 centimas from Tuesday's prices. Such was the staking effect of the slarm in European quarters over the pass to which affairs in China have come. To the alarm on account of the Chinese crisis must be added renewed unsatiness over the financial conditions at Berlin, where there was a condition bordering on a panic both yesterday and today. WARM SPRINGS, Or., July 4.-(To the Editor.)-in your issue of the 3d inst., note the comments of your Washington correspondent, under the head of "Gossip at the National Capital," and I herowith beg to correct the erroneous impressions that such statement would tend to con-vey in reference to the dropping of the United States Judian Agent at Warm Springs Agency, Oregon. It was not a question of the necessity of an agent at said reservation that prompted such ag-tion, as all well-informed persons well Conser. This man Conser did not like the agent at Warm Springs, for the reason that said agent would not assist him in covering up and whitewashing notoriously immoral conduct on the part of some school employes, and the record of the agent being unassallable as to his duttes, this method of defeating an appropriation for the agent was adopted and urged by

the school people, that they might have no one on guard except of their own like and choosing. There are more than 1000 Indians upon this reserve, far removed from civilizing

influences. They require an agent who will watch their interests, who will go into their fields and teach, and teach them in the practical methods of life, and teach them how to care for their individual holdings. No superintendent has or will do this, as all his time and ener-gies are required at the school. These Indian people should not be neglected by the Government. They have always been oyal, aiding our troops in both the Snake and Modoc wars. In fact, Albert Kuclup, a resident Indian, captured Captain Jack, in the lava beds of Southern Oregon. Such acts should not be repaid by, neglect at the instance of a small Supervisor, who is incompetent to judge of the re-guirements of the Indian residents of this

agency. No Government Inspector or special agent has ever made such recommendation, as they clearly know that it
