IN SEVEN DEVILS.

A Country Remarkable for Copper and Scenery.

Mayor Richards, who has just returned from a visit to the Seven Devils country, is more than ever before confident that that section is destined to surprise the country as a producer of copper. The Mayor grew enthusiastic in talking about the possibilities of that district in a mining way, but no more so than when he dwelt upon the scenery, which he took in from the highest of the seven peaks that the locality fts name.

Looking down fully 5000 feet below I saw the Snake River, winding its tor-tuous course between the mountains." he said. "Looking back, I saw the mounhe said. "Looking back, I saw the mountains, in never-ending billows, receding from the peak on which I stood. It was grand. I was never before more impressed with the majesty of our mountains. It appeared as though if a man were to fall from the point where I stood he would land in Snake River, scarcely touching the mountain side. I scarcely touching the mountain side. I involuntarily shrank back mountainward. The Kleinschmidt grade winds down the side of the mountain to the river. It is in miles long, and was built to get down a distance of a mile. That will give some idea of the charp angle of the mountain

Mayor Richards said work was now under way on the Decorah mine, near the Blue Jacket, which would demonstrate the extent of the Seven Devils lodges, which are so mammoth on the surface. The Decorah has been bored into with a diamond drill, and cores of yeary nicediamond drill, and cores of very nice-tooking ore have been taken out. The esselt of this drilling was so satisfactory that it was decided to run a long tunnel to tap the ledge at great depth. Work is now procressing on this tunnel, which will tap the ledge 200 feet below the

apex.
"If the showing down there is what is confidently expected, the future of the Beven Devils is assured. Nothing can prevent it becoming one of the sreatest copper producers in the world. The tunnel, I was informed, would be completed the desired distance by the 1st of Occions."
