

WOOL IS LOOKING UP

SEVERAL SALES MADE AT HEPPER... AT BETTER PRICES.

Chicago Buyers Enter the Field—Lamb is Selling at \$2 a Head to Feed Over Winter.

HEPPER, Or., Aug. 18.—The Hepper wool market has taken a turn for the better, and recent sales foot up about 50,000 pounds.

Chicago buyers enter the field—Lamb is selling at \$2 a head to feed over winter.

Sheep are in active demand at firm prices, and 50,000 head have recently changed owners in this district.

There is plenty of hay here to winter all stock. In an average winter it requires 30 tons to feed a head of 2000 lbs.

Morrow County is piling up a very large surplus of wheat for export, and farmers report choice plump berries with yields varying from 15 to 25 bushels to the acre.

Valuable minerals that are known to exist in the mountains south from Hepper are now receiving attention.

Butler and eggs are now very scarce in Oregon. There are busy re-feathering, and there is too much haying and harvesting going on to bother about butter.
