ALASKAN MAILS.

Yokon River Contract Given to Canadian Company.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 28.-The Postoffice Department has authorised a star service route from Skagway to St. Michael, Alaska, over the lines of the Canadian Development Company. This company will be regulred to carry all letter math from Skagway, by way of Dawson, Forty Mile, Sagle, Star, Circle, Rampart, Tanans, Koyukuk, Nuiste and Eaton to St. dichael, a distance of 1663 miles, making two round trips a month, leaving Skigway on the 8th and 226 of each month, so trip to consume over @ days. In conjunction with this line, they are to run a branch service to Nome, by way of Ch'nnick, 260 miles and back, making two round trips a month, a naecting with the steamers on the main schedule. This contract will be in force from December 1 1990, until March 31, 1991, the contractor being required to furnish, equi) and ma ntain suitable relay stations along the route. This same company has contracted to carry the mails from Eaton to Kotzebue Mission, 40 miles, two round trips a month, beginning January 1, 1991.
