ANTHRACITE MINERS WILL GO OUT NEXT MONDAY.

Request of Pennsylvania Districts Indorsed—142,000 Men Will Throw Down Their Tools. INDIANAPOLIS, Sept. 12.—At 8:15 o'clock this afternoon President Mitchell and Secretary Wilson, of the United Mineworkers of America, advised their signatory delegates that they had called 142,000 miners of the Pennsylvania anthracite region from their work Monday morning and precipitate one of the most gigantic strikes in the history of the world.
