

STRIKE IN SEATTLE

Trades Council and Builders' Exchange at Outs.

1100 TO 1300 WORKMEN ARE IDLE

Work Stopped on Over Thirty Residence Buildings and Six Large Business Blocks.

SEATTLE, Oct. 8.—Eleven hundred to thirteen hundred trade unionists idle work stopped on over thirty residence buildings and six large business blocks, and a threatened paralysis of nearly the entire building industry in the city is the result of the fight between the trades council and builders' exchange, of Seattle, a fight that has been brewing for several weeks. There seems to be a determination on both sides to hold out, neither one being willing to yield a point.

The main point at controversy is the demand on the part of the trades unionists that contractors of the Builders' Exchange sign an agreement to pay a certain scale of wages for one year. Many of the members of the exchange are already paying the scale, and others have been for some time, but they object to tying themselves up by an agreement reaching so far ahead. These contractors who have yielded and signed the agreement are having no trouble.

GENERAL STRIKE ORDERED.

Trades Council Demands That Contractors Sign Scale of Wages.

SEATTLE, Wash., Oct. 8.—The trades council of Seattle, at a meeting last night, decided to order a strike on all buildings in course of erection by contractors who refused to sign the scale of wages demanded by the council. Work will be stopped on between 30 and 40 buildings, and it is estimated that fully 1000 men will be out of employment. The building firms are holding out against the demands, although they say they are not in a position to do so, but it is thought they will accede soon to the time and stand the damage to buildings which must ensue if the wet weather sets in before the settlement is made.

SMALL STRIKE IN OREGON CITY.

Laborers on Sewers Claim Wages Were Reduced Without Consent.

OREGON CITY, Oct. 8.—This forenoon 12 workmen, who had been quit work when it was incidentally learned from the timekeeper that they would be paid at the rate of \$1.75 per day for shoveling, although they were told at the beginning that they would get \$2 per day as rockworkers. At noon the foreman informed the men that they would be paid \$1.75 per day for rockwork, including shoveling, and they returned. The other six remained out for the reason that the contractors would not pay them \$2 in full for the time already put in. The leader of the strike at first gave out the information that \$2 or \$3 men quit work at the time, but investigation brought out the fact that only 12 hands threw down their tools, the other men not having claimed.

SUIT FOR DEFAMATION OF CHARACTER.

Baker City, Oct. 8.—Mrs. Emma Potter, of Sumpter, instituted suit today against John Austin, Marshal of Baker City.

The complaint charges that Austin, in a letter to the editor of the local paper, published on Oct. 6, had defamed the character of the plaintiff. The amount asked for is \$5000. The suit grew out of the arrest of Mrs. Potter last summer on a charge of keeping a disorderly house.

GOVERNOR GEORGE IN IDAHO.

SALEM, Oct. 8.—Governor George left last night for Boise, Idaho, where he will speak tonight on the political issues of the campaign. He will remain in Idaho several days, and will deliver several campaign addresses.

OREGON NOTES.

The improvements to the La Grande National Bank have been completed.

The Arlington smallpox patient has been discharged and the pesthouse closed.

The total enrollment for the month of September in the Marshfield school was 200 pupils.

More new houses have been built in the north end of the Summer and Fall than for several years.

There is talk of organizing a stock company at Enterprise for the purpose of erecting a hotel building.

The Bryan Club, of Enterprise, has challenged the Enterprise Club to a discussion of political issues.

The new bridge across the North Fork at the Cooper place in Coos County has been finished and accepted.

A new social club, called the Alce, has been organized at Albany. The name is taken from the first letters of Albany, Llan County, Or.

Notwithstanding a new schoolhouse has been built at Fossil, facilities are still crowded, and a new building will be necessary next year.

Greiner's threshing crew has been at work for some time. The reason given is that Indians are not so numerous there this season as they have been heretofore.

Three murder cases will be tried at the present session of court in Umatilla County. Mrs. Minnie Crockett is the first woman to be tried for murder in that county.

Eagle Valley will be represented at the Southern Interstate fair at Atlanta, Ga. The display will be a complete one of the products of the district, both agricultural and mineral.

C. W. Andrews, of the Sunlaw, has purchased the gasoline launch owned by the Holland Bros. of Coos Bay. The launch will be taken the launch around to the Sunlaw.

Rents of dwelling properties are advancing in Stayton, in some cases 50 and even 100 per cent. This is due to a scarcity of houses and a general improvement in the market.

It is reported that there are a number of whales near the mouth of the Columbia. They are said to be 50 and 60 feet long, and seem to be in pursuit of the salmon and herring entering the river.

It is reported that a number of Spring calves have been stolen along the Union County side of the Wallawa and Minak Rivers. It is also stated that F. F. Slank, of Summerville precinct, found a number of calves in another man's field, marked and branded. The ownership of the calves was readily determined by the cows from which they had been taken.

Not long ago a resident of Turner built him a sidewalk and in doing so raised it about eight inches above the adjoining walks. A delegation of the wheelmen called upon him and requested him to lower it to a level with the adjoining one. The request was refused, and during the succeeding night the walk in some manner mysteriously disappeared, and now the case is up to the authorities.

P. C. Brown, superintendent of the Coos County Road Commission, has been elected Deputy Fish Commissioner of that district, reports that he is keeping a patrol on that portion of the headwaters of Coos River where the fish slide fishing, and as yet has not found any transgressors of the law. Fishing above Daniels Creek on South Coos River and the Government rock quarry on North Coos River is forbidden by law.

Greiner's threshing crew has a half-grown bear for a mascot, says the Fossil Journal. It wandered down from the mountains of Wheeler County to the Gilliam County wheat fields near Mayville, and right there it made a mistake. The threshers sighted him, and mounted their horses and gave chase. The bear led them a merry chase up and down the rills, and it took the threshers half a day to get it down. When it was exhausted, Paul Greiner threw a rope over it, and since then the crew has a mascot that travels with them wherever they go, and will be sold at auction when the threshing season is over.

GUN ACCIDENTALLY DISCHARGED.

William Brock Seriously Injured as Result of Mishap.

ALBANY, Or., Oct. 8.—William Brock, a farmer residing on this side of the Coos, was dangerously wounded last evening in a gun accident. He was talking in the road with a neighbor, Peter McDonald, who held a Winchester repeating shotgun. Mr. Brock was holding the gun when it was accidentally discharged. The entire charge struck his left shoulder, ranging downward, cutting the collar-bone in two and shattering the shoulder-blade in two and lodging in the body, the hole made being as large as an egg.

No Converts to Democracy.

Voorhees' Efforts in That Direction a Dismissal Failure in Vancouver.

VANCOUVER, Wash., Oct. 8.—A big Democratic meeting was held here tonight. Hon. James A. Munday presided, and opened with a brief address.

Hon. Charles S. Voorhees was the principal speaker. His address was devoted almost entirely to imperialism, and a scathing arraignment of the Administration of Abraham Lincoln policy. He said in part:

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
