## VOTER AND PRECINCY.

Decision of Supreme Court Cited in Election Law.

PORTLAND, Oct. 16.—(To the Editor.)— In an editorial in this morning's Ore-gonian, under the caption. "May Vote Away From Home," the statement is made that "one may vote outside his precinct, in his own county, if he is willing to take the trouble of proof." The "de-cision" of County Clerk Holmes published a few days ago is to the same effect. This is not the law. The Supreme Court of this state settled that question years ago. In Wood vs. Flizgerald, 3 Or. 568, the court in considering the right of stockmen, herders and others having no fixed residence, to vote, held that if a person "is a bona fide resident of a county, but has no fixed residence or domicile in any particular precinct therein, he may vote in any precinct in which he finds himself on the day of election," but that "when an individual has established for himself any precinct of a county, there he must vote." The opinion of the court was da-livered by the late Judge McArthur. The decision has never been questioned in the courts of the state, and it is the settled law that if a person has a fixed place of residence in a county, if he votes in such county, he must vote in the precinct of his residence. Mr. Holmes and The Oregonian is directly rtrary to the decision of the highest judicial tribunal of the state, and its ten dency is to open the door to all of the frauds which the registration law was designed to prevent. N. A. PEERY.
