Figures printed in The Oregonian's marine columns of Thursday show October exports of wheat and flour from Oregon and Washington amounting to over 2,000,000 bushels.

This growth is not destined to slacken for many years, for not only is much new land annually coming under cultivation, but the methods of farming which are applied to land already in use have improved to such an extent that the crop is annually becoming more certain.

On light lands, where a scarcity of moisture needs Walls, wheat is very uncertain crop. Somers wheat is now turning off very good yields.

Another factor of very great importance in assuring a crop is careful cultivation of the soil. By plowing deep and having the soil well loosened and mellow, much better crops are secured than by the old sward method of scratching over the top and exposing the soil to the sun.
