None shall participate in its bounty but Scotchmen, or the fami-lies of descendants of such, and only Scotchmen, or their descendants, are eligible for membership. The by-laws pro-vide that to further the interests of the society the members shall hold a general feunion on St. Andrew's day, in what-ever manner the society may deem the most appropriate, and to carry out this provision the smoking concert was held last night. ast night.

With the Scotch and American flags twined in unity near him, President Alexander H. Kerr, of the St. Andrew's Soslety, arose, in the presence of about 299 Scotchmen, to bid them welcome. He had the honor, he said, to read the following greetings telegraphed from sister socie-

He reminded them that 151 years ago, Z Scotchmen, in Philadelphia, years ago, in Scotenmen, in Philadelphia, formed the first St. Andrew's Society in this country. The New York St. Andrew's Society was formed in 1754, and has a permanent fund of \$190,000.
