TRADE OF BRITISH COLONIES

Market for Over \$500,000,000 Worth of British Goods Last Year.

washington, Jan. 4.—British coo-nies furnished last year a market for over \$00,000,000 worth of British goods. The "Statistical Abstract for the Several Coi-onies and Other Possessions of the United Kingdom," which presents the details of the commerce and conditions of the Brit-tale college. In the years 1800 converted ish colonies in the year 1809 compared with preceding years, has just reached the Treasury Bureau of Statistics. It the Treasury Bureau of Statistics. It shows that the British colonies throughout the world imported in 1895 goods valued at over \$1,000,000 may and of this amount over \$200,000,000 was from the United Kingdom.

England's largest colony, of course, is British India. Its total imports in 1899 are given in round terms at £50,000,000, or about \$300,000,000, of which £40,000,000, or about \$200,000,000, were imported from the United Kingdom.

Next in importance is Canada, whose total imports amount to £20,000,000, but which takes only £5,678,000 in value from the United Kingdom; the chief reason of this small proportion being its immediate proximity to the United States, which can supply more promptly and convenlently its varied wants.

Next in importance is the group of Australiasian colonies, whose reports above on the face an importation in round numbers of over £70,000,000 in 1839, though the fact that each colony counts as "an im-pertation" anything coming from any other Australian colony, even though merely brought across the line from adning territory, makes this statement of Australian "imports" a misleading one.
