Hard Winter Trip

C. A. Jones and Robert Watts, of Spe kune, are at Oro Pino, Idaho, recuperal ing from the effects of a trip from Mos-cow Bar to Oro Fino, a distance of 120 miles, which was made in December under great difficulties. They left Moscow Bar about December 1s, expecting to get out to settlements in five days, and started with a food supply sufficient for that pe-ried. They encountered four feet of soft which made their progress slow aborious. The mountain streams wore awolien to their greatest capacity, making the crossing of them extremely hazardous. Their food supply gave out before they had made half of the distance, and they lived two days on two biscuits each. Then followed five days without food. On the fifth day of their fast they crawled lig miles on hands and knees. They finally reached a cabin 25 miles above the mouth of the north fork of the Clearwater, where they found food. Mr. Jones mays if they had not reached food that day they would have perished before the next morning. The men ex-pect to go back to their claims as soon as the snow settles so that they can get in on snowshoes. In coming out they forded streams up to their china, and on me occasion Mr. Jones slipped on a ledge of rock and shot down the bluff into the
