DIVIDED FOR INSPECTION

PACIFIC COAST LIFE-SAVING DIS-TRICT GETS DOUBLE SERVICE.

Long Const Line Was Too Much to Be Covered From San Francisco -Alaska Extension.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 6.-Recent dis patches from Scattle indicated that a new Biosaving district, to include Oregon, Washington and Alaska, had recently been with headquarters at Tacoma Investigation at the Treasury Department revealed the fact that this statement was not strictly according to the order of the department. The matter, as explained by S. I. Kimball, chief of the Lafesaving Service, in an follows:

"The 18th lifesaving district now em-braces the entire Pacific Coast, extend-ing from the southern boundary of Call-fornia to the northern boundary of Wash-Ingion. We have no service now in op-eration in Alaska that comes under the regular organisation, although a sert of lifesaving service is operated at several points along the Alaskan coast, under the

direction of the revenue-cutter service.

"Heretofore the district officers have been a superintendent, with headquarters at San Francisco, and an inspector, with headquarters at the same place. On ac-count of the extreme length of the district it has been found necessary to take measures for a better supervision of the sixtions than can be exercised by one inspector Therefore the district has been divided, so far as the matter of inspec-tion is concerned. An additional inspec-tor, 'aptain W. H. Roberts, has been detailed by the Secretary of the Treasury to take charge of the lifesaving stations in Oregon and Washington, while the other inspector, with headquarters at San Francisco, will now have supervision only of the stations in California. The district superintendent still has general charge of both divisions, so far as his functions are concerned. The new inpector, by the way, s assigned from the revenue-cutter serv lee. His headquarters was made at Ta-coma because it was found, after a care-ful investigation, that from that point he would have more ready access to all the stations in his district than he would have ad from any other prominent point which senerally accessible as a commercial and shipping locality.
"As a matter of fact, it would take Con-

greesenal action to establish a new life-saving station, but no such step has been contemplated, and it is not anticipated at this time. The division of a district, so that more than one inspector may hold sway, is another matter that does not come within the bounds of departmental privileges.

'In regard to the extension of the service to Alaska, our bureau would be very glad to see an additional district created to embrace only the Alaskan coast, with beside only the beside of the hat it brict, and recommendations to that effect will in all probability be deterred until the first session of the 57th Congress. If such a district is finally created, it will all probability provide for a station at Nome, another at the mouth of the Yukon and probably a number of other stations at important shipping points along the coast as far around as Cape Barrow.
